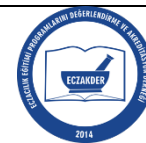

Lilian M. Azzopardi is a Professor of Pharmacy and Head of the Department of Pharmacy, Faculty of Medicine and Surgery at the University of Malta. She has led the innovative postgraduate international doctorate in pharmacy offered by the University of Malta in collaboration with the University of Illinois at Chicago. She published several papers and books mainly related to quality systems, pharmacist interventions, and pharmacy education. She has received research awards from the International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP) and the European Society of Clinical Pharmacy. She served as an ad-interim Director and a member of the Publications Committee of the European Society of Clinical Pharmacy and Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery at the University of Malta. Professor Azzopardi is a member of the editorial board of the Journal of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy and Associate Editor of the Pharmacy Education journal. Professor Azzopardi was the co-chair of the working group of the FIP Nanjing Statements on Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences Education and a core team member for the FIP Digital Health in Pharmacy Education. She is a member of the Advisory Group of the Academic Institutional Membership (AIM) within FIP.

Koster obtained a Ph.D. in Pharmacology in 1985 and taught statistics, physiology, pharmacology, and pharmacokinetics at the department of Pharmaceutical Sciences in the University College of Utrecht, and the Roosevelt Academy in Middelburg. After 1998, he developed new curricula for the biomedical sciences (B.Sc. and several M.Sc. programs) and pharmaceutical sciences (B.Pharm., Pharm.D. and College of Pharmaceutical Sciences). Between 2008 and 2014, he has been a Director of Education in the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences. Since 2014 he has been Director of Educational Research of the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences and has supervised two Ph.D. projects studying motivation of pharmacists in postgraduate education. In addition, he is a member of the Executive Committee and Treasurer of the European Association of Faculties of Pharmacy (EAFP). He has been involved in several European projects (e.g., PharQA). Currently, he is involved in a global FIPed-project for the development of a Competency-based education implementation handbook. Andries Koster is an associate professor and alumnus of the Centre of Excellence in University Teaching (CEUT). He (co)authored approximately 95 scientific publications.
